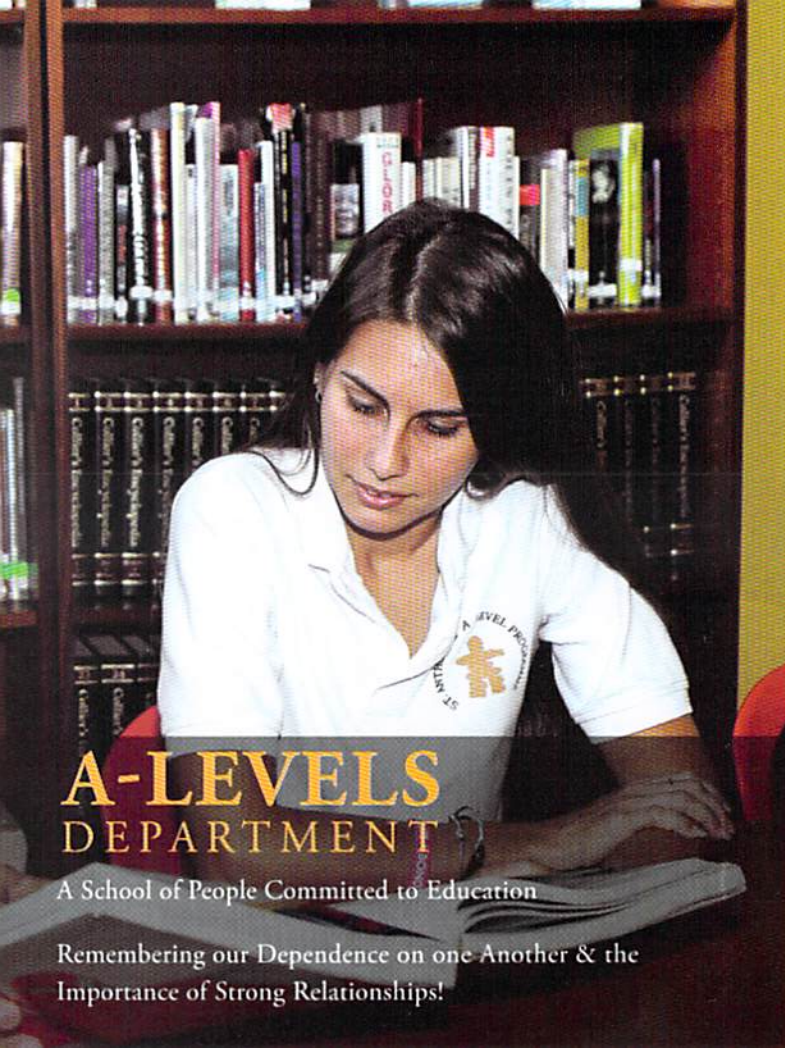

## GENERAL COMMENTS

A student who is admitted to study three subjects at CAPE must expect to have his/her position reviewed at the end of the school year. If, at the end of the first year, the pupil's progress is not satisfactory, he/she may be, in his/her own interest, required to drop one of these subjects, repeat the year, or withdraw from school.

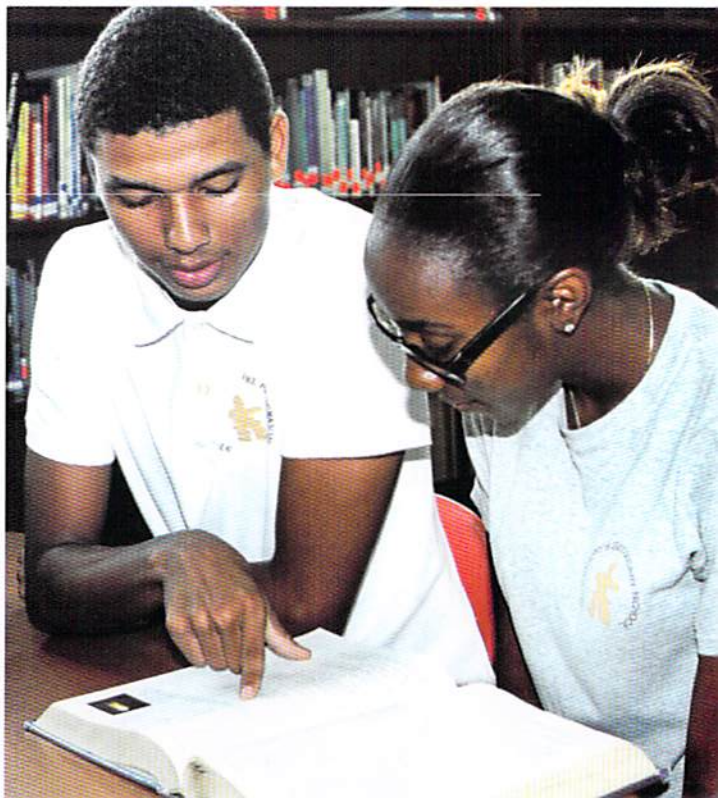
Students are advised to choose their subject combinations very carefully. They should be aware of the heavy volume of reading required (e.g. English - History - Geography); the complementary nature of certain subject areas, (e.g. Mathematics - Geography; Biology - Chemistry); and the pitfalls inherent in the combination of unrelated disciplines, (e.g. English - French - Biology).

In particular, students should also, at this point, carefully investigate the alternatives which will determine the next stage of their careers after completing their Advanced Level courses.

All students in the advanced level program **MUST** follow courses in Caribbean Studies and Communications Studies. Volunteer work is also mandatory for ALL students.

## UNIFORM

It is required to wear a school polo shirt which is either red, blue, gold, white or black with the school's crest, along with jeans— these cannot be distressed blue or black.





## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A student may seek admission to the St. Anthony's A-Level Program. The basic criteria for consideration of admission are:

- i. Students must have a minimum of five (5) subjects, including Mathematics and English A at General Proficiency Level.  
(a) If a student does not have a pass in either English or Math, the student must attain passes in either or both subjects within their first year.
  - ii. Grade I or II (CXC-CSEC) is preferred in the subjects requested for advanced level studies.
  - iii. Students must qualify in the prerequisite CSEC subjects(s) for the study of CAPE advanced level subjects.
- Students must register to a minimum of three (3) CAPE courses and a suggested maximum of four (4) CAPE courses for a duration of two years; or register to take two (2) CAPE courses and one (1) or two (2) CSEC courses for a duration of two years.
  - A mandatory 1 hour per week voluntary work program that will also be in effect.

## SUBJECTS OFFERED

There must be at least three registered students in a course for it to be offered. Combinations which include the Arts and Science subjects are not advisable since these subjects are rarely complementary on the timetable.
